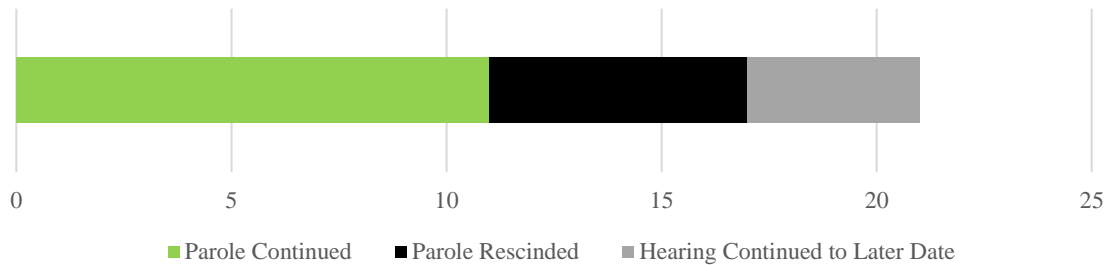


## RESCISSION HEARINGS: FISCAL YEAR 2020 (7/1/2019-6/30/2020)

In some instances, a parole hearing is held prior to an individual's parole eligibility date; or there is some other reason for delay between the parole hearing where the Board approves an individual to be released into the community on parole, and the individual's actual release from an institution. On occasion, during this time period, circumstances may change or arise that alter that individual's eligibility or suitability for parole. In these cases, the Board holds a rescission hearing to determine whether the changed circumstances prevent the individual from being released into the community on parole. Data on the 21 rescission hearings held between July 2019 and June 2020 is displayed in the graphs below.

### What are the Factors that lead to Rescinding Parole?

When the Board issues a decision to rescind parole for an inmate, that rescission is tied to one or more specific factors that relate to the inmate's suitability for parole at that time. For any one rescission hearing, a single or several factors may be documented as reasons for the rescission. The factors that were documented in the rescission hearings with a decision of parole continued or rescinded between July 2019 and June 2020 are listed below:
